Collective Worship

As a school we celebrate daily acts of collective worship throughout the year through classroom prayer, assemblies, class masses, whole school masses and retreat days. We invite parents/carers to celebrate with us also.

Prayer Buddies

Children from different classes/Key stages are paired together at the beginning of the year as Prayer Buddies. Throughout the year, they meet regularly to pray together and develop their faith as children of God.

Prayer Partnership

We pray for and with our families and the wider community. Throughout the year we send home Prayer Bags and invite others to join us in Stay and Pray. Our children write prayers to share throughout School and assemblies, liturgies, collective worship and during Masses, both in School at Church.

A Place to Pray

Each class has a dedicated prayer station, in addition to their class altar, and throughout School there are quiet places for everyone to pray and reflect, including our Chaplaincy.

Year 5- The Apostles Creed

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.
